

Doubles Cornhole Rules



1. Roster

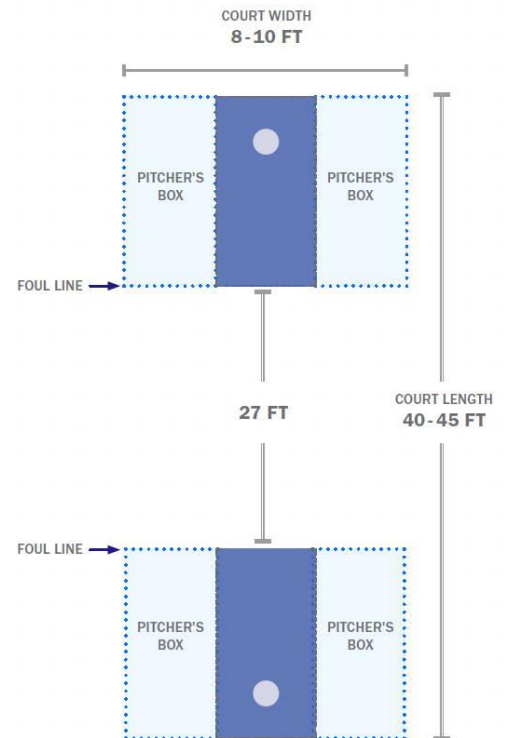
- Teams will consist of 2 players and 1 alternate for a total of 3 people.

2. Court Layout

- Pitcher's Box – 3'x4' parallel to the board and on both sides of the board
- Foul Lines – 27' between the front of each board

3. How To Play

- Team A will compete against Team B in a best of 3 format to win to match
 - Each team will stay in their designated lane the entire round
 - Teams will alternate lanes every round
- Players at the headboard (Pitchers) will alternate throws until each player has thrown all 4 of their bags (this completes an inning)
- Players at footboard will take score and resume pitching to the other board, beginning a new inning
- Pitching Rotation:
 - Winner of coin toss may pick toss order to begin the match
 - The team that scored in the preceding inning will pitch first
 - If no points were scored, the pitching order continues from the previous inning



4. Collaborative Scoring

- Teams will work together to score
 - If an agreement cannot be made, a judge will make the decision
- Points
 - Woody (1 point) – Any bag that rests on top of the board (Bag In-The-Count)
 - Cornhole (3 points) – Any bag that goes through the hole (Bag In-The-Hole)
 - Foul Bag (0 points) – Any bag that has not been deemed a cornhole or woody
- Cancelation Scoring
 - Each inning, the points of one player cancel out their opponents' points
 - Only one team can score points each inning

5. Winning

- First team to exactly 21 points at the conclusion of an inning is the winner of the round
- If you go over 21 points, that innings points will be voided

6. Fouls

- Pitcher steps outside of the pitcher's box – remove from board
- Any bag not delivered within 20 seconds – forfeit throw
- Any bag contacting the ground before resting on the board – remove from board
- Any bag removed from the board before score has been agreed upon – forfeit remaining bags
- An accidental dropped bag without forward trajectory is not a foul and may be rethrown
 - Protest – If a player desires to protest, a judge shall make the final ruling on the protest

7. Tournament

- The end-of-season tournament will have a "shootout rule" where each round is capped at 7 innings per team member
 - Your team needs to get to or over 21 points in the allotted innings, otherwise high score will win the round
